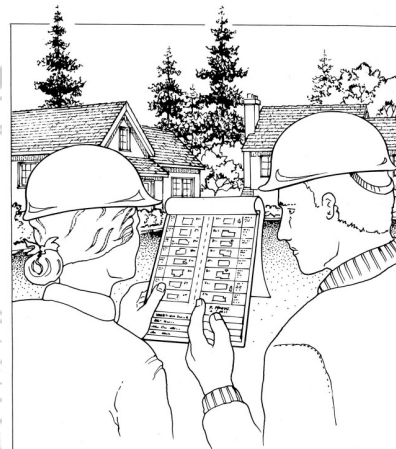


EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS WORKSHOP FOR OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

What is a disaster?

Disasters, by definition, are events that overwhelm police, fire, and medical 911 emergency responders.

Why MYN?

MYN helps us organize a timely response to disaster when 911 is unavailable. All of us, working together, can reduce the serious consequences of disaster in our neighborhood.

What will we do?

- We will learn a 9-step Neighborhood Response Plan that immediately helps us know what to do – both at home and in the neighborhood – to respond to injuries, leaking natural gas, and assisting people who may be in need. The process is proven, fun, and easy. The program is endorsed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and used in 22 states.

- We will identify the skills and equipment each neighbor has that are useful in an effective and timely disaster response.

- We will learn how to map our neighborhood's natural gas meters and propane tank locations so we can quickly respond to leaking gas and reduce the threat of fire.
